Now, it is time to make your voting plan.

We are now one month away from election day, and it is time to get serious about how you will make your voice heard in the 2020 general election.

What are your options? Let's break them down:

REGISTER

Just turned 18? Know someone who just turned 18? Recently moved? Doubting everything and no longer trusting yourself to remember your name much less if you are registered to vote (#2020)? If you answered "yes" to any of these questions, [click here to register to vote or check you registration](#). You must be registered by October 5. Do it today!

MAKE A VOTING PLAN

You have three options, and they are all good options (yes, even voting by mail).

1. **MAIL.** A great option if you or a loved one is immunocompromised or you don't feel comfortable standing in line. You need to request your ballot NOW. Do not wait until the end of September, or worse, October. [Click here to request your ballot](#) today.
Once your ballot arrives via USPS, fill it out that day and mail it back or drop it off in a secure ballot drop off box
[Click here to find a drop box if you live in Fulton or DeKalb](#). It will be like returning a library book or Blockbuster VHS.
2. **EARLY & IN-PERSON.** In-person early voting starts October 12 in Georgia. Here's everything you need to know: <https://georgia.gov/early-voting>
3. **ON ELECTION DAY (November 3).** Mask up, bring water, and make a plan if you need a ride.

What if I request a mail in ballot then decide to vote in person?

You can totally do that. Do not complete your mail-in ballot when it comes. Take it with you to the polling place (early voting or day of). Tell the poll worker you requested a mail-in ballot but have not completed.

Will my vote really be counted if I vote by mail?

Nothing in life is 100% guaranteed. However, voting by mail is, and always has been, a safe, secure way to vote. If voting by mail works best for you, choose this option. But do it NOW. It is not too early.

We do recommend dropping it off in one of the approved places, to avoid mail delays.
